Key Ideas

Literacy: We will write suspense stories based on the robbery in 'What the ladybird heard'. We will write non-fiction, information texts about animals.

Maths: Year 1 will learn about numbers to 50. Year 2 will continue to learn about multiplication and division before going on to learn about measurement.

RE: Why is Easter important to Christians? We will explore the story of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection.

Science: We will learn about the five classes of vertebrates: mammals, reptiles, amphibians, birds and fish.

Geography: We will learn about the Kalahari desert in Africa and its location close to the equator. We will learn the four points of a compass.

Design Technology: We will explore wheels and axles and design a moving enrichment toy for an animal.

Art - We will complete artwork inspired by the continent of Africa, including weaving, jewellery and wildlife painting.

PE - We will develop gymnastic sequences using different body shapes such as pike and tuck.

There are five vertebrate animal classes: mammals, reptiles, amphibians, fish and birds.

There are four points of a compass: north, south, east and west.

A continent is a large solid area of land made up of a group of countries.
