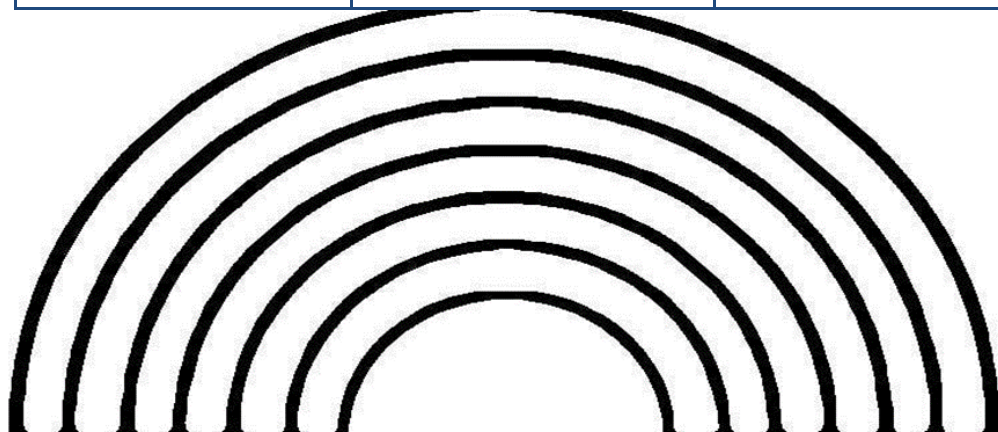


Year 5/6 Homework Term 3– Out of this World

What information will you include?	Create a moon diary. Look at the moon every night for 4 days in a row, draw what it looks like each night. How does it change?	Bake your own space themed cakes or biscuits. They could be star, rocket or planet shaped. Write the recipe out.	Evaluate a piece of work that you have completed this term. What were you proud of? What would you change if you were to do it again?
Write a creative description of the planet Mars. Look at images online of what it is like and describe using simile, metaphor and adverbials.	If you were faced with an emergency, write a set of instructions as to what you would need to do and how to be safe.	Create your own news report about current events in your life.	Write a fact file about Tim Peake, Neil Armstrong or any other famous astronaut.	Write a newspaper report about the first moon landing.	Create a timeline to show the history of space travel.
