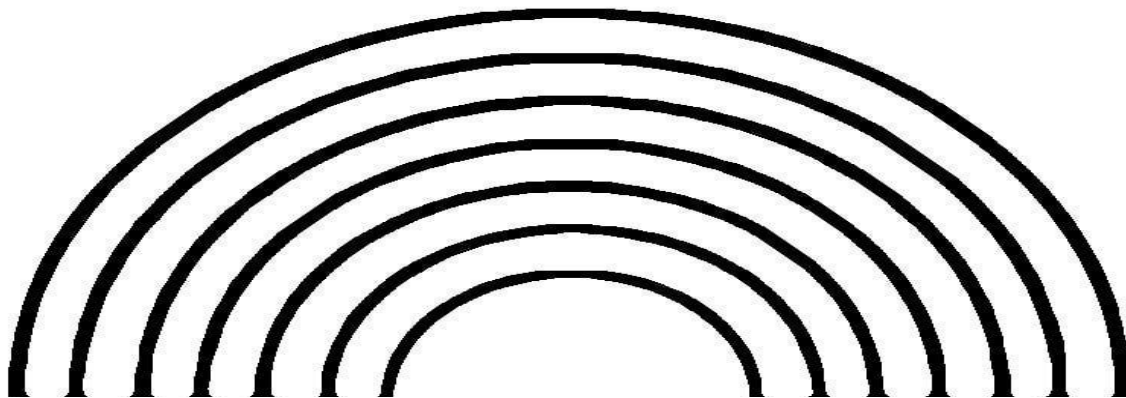


Year One and Two Homework Term 5 - A Work of Art

Draw or paint a portrait of a relative. Write sentences to describe the person's features.	Draw one person dressed for hot weather and another kitted out for cold weather. Explain your reasons. Why you have dressed them like you have?	Can you make up your own subtraction word problems. E.g. the tree had 42 apples on it, 17 fell off, how many were left? Can you answer them too?	Look around your local area for sculptures. What are they? How are they different from drawings? Make a sculpture of your own using any choice of materials. Describe how you made it to the class.	Show your understanding of the seven continents and five oceans in any way you choose.	What makes someone a good team player? Write about how we might feel when winning and losing and how we can try to be part of a team.
Find out 3 facts about an artist of your choice. It could be an artist from the UK or an artist from another country.	Show your understanding of halves, quarters and thirds.	Look at the artwork by Keith Haring.. What is his style? Try creating some artwork of your own in a similar style.	Think of a two digit number. How many different ways can you make your number, using addition or subtraction, multiplication or division. Use objects or drawings to help you if you need to.	Create your own representation of a famous piece of art work. What is the artwork called and who was the original artist?	Write one thing you liked about your piece of art work and one thing you would do differently next time.



Please select one homework task each week, ensuring that you select your task from a different column each time. This will ensure that a variety of different skills is practised. Use your imagination to decide how to present your work.
